KERRI (BUCHBERGER) KENDRIOZA

Kerri (Buchberger) Kendrioza started her volleyball career at the age of 14 in Langenberg, SK. It was during a summer camp that a University of Saskatchewan athlete asked her if she had ever tried out for a Provincial team. Coming from a small town she had never heard of such a thing but found the information and went to the ‘big city’ of Yorkton to try out the following spring. This was the start of her amazing volleyball career.

From 1985 – 1989 Kerri was a part of Team Sask, where Doug Reimer and Miles Kydd helped guide and develop her skills. She was a part of the 1989 Provincial team that represented Saskatchewan at the Canada Games, and through hard work and dedication the team brought back the Gold Medal to Saskatchewan.

Kerri was a member of the University of Regina’s Women’s Volleyball team from 1988 – 1991. She was twice named a Great Palins Athletic Conference All-star during her three-year career at the U of R.

Following her CIAU career, Buchberger played for eight seasons with the Canadian National Team starting in 1991. During her time with the National Team program she trained out of Regina, and Winnipeg, and competed in 2 Pan Am Games (finishing 3rd in 1995), World Cup, Norcea’s and the highlight coming in 1996 at the Olympic Games in Atlanta, Georgia, USA.

Kerri went on to play 5 years of professional volleyball in Europe in Belgium, Holland and France and continues to play with the Canadian Master Women’s team.

She was inducted into the University of Regina’s Sports Hall of Fame in 2000.
